REMEMBER?

- Way Back When
 - Teacher and a Teacher's Aide
- Parents volunteer as teaching aide now
- Two adults are always better than one

WHAT IS TEAM TEACHING?

- Interactive team teaching two faculty members present in front of the class simultaneously.
- Rotational format team teaching faculty alternate teaching the class. This rotational format has a number of variations depending on the subject matter and the number of faculty involved.
- Participant-observer team teaching all participating faculty are present for all the classes, but only one is "teaching" at a time. Roles that the other teachers could play as participating observer(s) are model learner, observer, panel member, or resource (Klein, 1990).

BENEFITS

- Constructivist Approach to Student Learning Students see the same material from different teachers/experts
- Encourages Active Learning prima facie, there are two people leading the class, and students can engage with both; whole is greater than the parts Taken from Center for Excellence and Teaching & Learning, U of Detroit Mercy
- **No more teacher silos** We learn tips from one another, get a chance to develop curriculum, and refresh curriculum; PD and support of one another and students
- Guest speaker feeling lasts throughout the semester

MORE BENEFITS

More Scheduling Options from within the same discipline

Easiest – Double Online Section

Easy – Double In person Section (space limitations)

Still Easy- Have two courses at the same time, rotate the instructors

Bit Harder – Run two hybrids, e.g. TTh 9:30
