- "Are there any objections?"
- If there is an objection, then we go continue to Motion, Second, Discussion and Vote.
- If no objections, then the item is approved by acclamation and no vote is necessary.

Counseling Resolution

- Ongoing concerns regarding the removal of remote work opportunity.
- New concerns regarding the scrutiny of contract language and job duties.
- Lack of transparency, inclusivity, and collaboration.
- Unnecessary time and energy spent on contractual issues instead of focusing on student needs and shortage of counselors.
- Counselors not feeling supported considering the numerous initiatives and ongoing technology demands in their jobs.
