- A roadmap from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office Vision 2030
- Goal: Build an equitable, inclusive higher education system
- Focus: Tailored student support, degree attainment, economic mobility
- Targets historically underserved communities

STRATEGIC DUAL ENROLLMENT GOALS

1. Early Exposure – Enroll 9th graders in college, career & apprenticeship pathways
2. Credit Completion – Increase by 15% the number of students graduating with 12+ college units
3. Career Focus – Expand career assessments & exploration opportunities

GUIDED PATHWAYS ALIGNMENT

- Vision 2030 supports the Guided Pathways framework:
 - Get on the Path (Start in 9th Grade)
 - Stay on the Path (Student Support)
 - Ensure Learning and Progress
- Linked to CA's 70% degree/certificate attainment goal for adults 25-64 by 2030

SUPPORTING STUDENT SUCCESS

- 4. Education Planning** – Teach college planning, financial aid access, support programs
- 5. Equity-Driven Expansion** – Reach historically underserved student populations
- 6. Barrier Removal** – Streamline enrollment and bolster integrated support services
