5. Committees:	Technology: Bryan Lam- As an FYI, Bryan shared the ranking of the Technology Requests that came from the Annual Unit Plans for the upcoming fiscal year, 2023-2024. 	Bryan also shared the plan the Technology Committee devised to maximize savings on physical technology (hardware) like Chromebooks. The savings garnered using Chromebooks vs. laptops will provide funding to increase WIFI access in areas with this need.		
	PIEC: Jayden/Juliana – They reported on issues with students not getting textbooks at the beginning of the semester. Our bookstore, Barnes & Noble, was not able to get textbooks in on time due to a credit hold. Our EOPS students were heavily impacted.		
	Groups around campus are working on writing details/information for accreditation as we look towards our next accreditation process using the updated on process for 2024.

	Staffing: Lisa- Chris Yatooma, our VPAS consultant, went over the 50% & 25/75 laws for faculty; this is known as the FON (Faculty Obligation Number). Support services are funded out of the other 50% but our budget cant support the need or cost in the current formula. Augustine and Brodney also share from Academic Staffing. The meeting got cut short for the opening of Bldg 36. More FON discussion (AFT is pushing for a 75% FON.) and Joan to speak about AUP.

This document is similar to the Faculty 10+1; each document outlines the topics each group needs to be consulted on as far as governance at our college. We would like to add the 9+1 to the GC Administrative Procedure 2510. Please share your thoughts and ideas. The Chancellor had suggestions as to the 9+1. She voiced concern over the +1 for both the Faculty (10-1) and the Classified (9+1). Discussion ensued that made it clear our Classified Professionals want to retain control of this document and any other issues that affect our group. Our next step is to take this 9+1 to the Academic Senate as informational only. We want to be collegial and share with our academic counterparts whenever processes are changed. Ultimately the updated AP 5210 with our 9+1 will go to DEC, the District's Executive Council. Classified bullying was discussed and support given to CP who is experiencing the current incure.
