Dawn shared the implementation of a new login screen and a potential summer/fall Canvas IMPACT campaign to promote effective Regular and Substantive Interaction (RSI).

IV. OTLC's help requested with a genuinely fun project!—Adelle

Adelle discussed her plans to use a mock course as a training tool for faculty evaluators and instructors. She proposed that some volunteers participate as students for a week, completing tasks such as discussion boards, quizzes, and assignments. The goal is to create a course artifact that provides a realistic and safe way to model the evaluation process for RSI specifically.

Adelle also mentioned creating a "dark side" course to demonstrate practices that need improving. The group looked at a sample page from the course, including excessive warnings, lack of trust, and poor user experience. Suggestions included adding more examples of practices needing improvement, such as using text headers for long paragraphs and linking to PDFs without explanation. Adelle agreed to incorporate these suggestions and worsen the layout.

The team also discussed the possibility of having one course with good and bad examples, but decided to keep them separate for now.

Adelle discussed the upcoming project that will start next week, involving grading and submitting assignments in the mock course.

Tate discussed the formation of an AI task force, which will have implications for online teaching and learning. The task force's draft membership includes the online education coordinator and the instructional design technology specialists from both colleges.
