4. <u>Review PD Plans from</u> other colleges	Victoria added San Diego City College, San Diego Mesa College, and Santa Rosa Junior College as PD plans to review to add insight and ideas to the Grossmont College PD Plan draft. Victoria then broke the committee members into groups to review these plans. Group 1 reviewed San Diego City College, Group 2 review San Diego Mesa College, and Group 3 reviewed Santa Rosa Junior College. Groups reviewed their specific plans for 20 minutes. The groups relayed the following items that they liked:		
	San Diego City: There is a lot of information and resources and PDAC. The group did not like the huge size of their committee. A committee this size could thwart the work done in the committee. It was compressive but there was a lot of overlap with outdated information.		
	San Diego Mesa: Mesa's introduction, mission, vision, and values, PD objectives, processes, and overview and the 4 strands which had four main developmental employee's career goals. Did not like how lengthy the document was.		
	Santa Rosa Junior: Did not like that there was no visuals in the plan and it was all textual. Not clearly defined breakdown of the strategic plan of their district. No PD committee goals listed. Did not specifically list what changes were made and when after listing accomplishments. Some other tool besides email to remind employees of PD events and trainings. The document was very long.
