Lida Rafia & Courtney Williams are assuming the GP work with Cindi Harris, Gary Johnson and, Shawn Hicks as Co-Coordinators. • A Program Coordinator, Program Specialist will be hired through the foundation. • Working on a process to see who else needs to be involved in GP. • Once people and positions on GP have been resolved a communication will then go out to campus about the changes. 2) Strong Workforce Faculty Institute <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1st Strong Workforce institute was held last week. Approximately 246 faculty through the region attended. Victoria, Catherine and Javier are conducting a Strong Workforce Faculty Institute with 25 GC faculty over the spring. Many of those faculty are participating in tomorrow's 12 Gateway Symposium. 3) College Planning and Institutional Effectiveness <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SS&EC works in conjunction with PIEC using student access, success, and equity data and research to support programs and services of the college. • PIEC has been discussing key performance indicators. To build awareness within the committee, they are looking at what is State mandated vs. federally mandated. CPIE will review the AUPs, but PIEC will be informed about what is coming up within the AUPs.
