7. Draft of Student Equity Plan from summer retreats	The committee reviewed the most recent draft of the Student Equity Plan 2025-2028 that was drafted over the summer during the SEP Summer Retreats. They reviewed metrics and strategies discussed for each: • Successful Enrollment • Early alert system (pilot and business process analysis) • Sustainable outreach funding (Admit Day, tours, registration, parent workshops) • Expanded evening admission events for working adults • Term-to-Term Persistence • Expand ZTC/OER adoption • Strengthen book voucher programs (EOPS, campus bookstore) • Increase supports for student parents • Completion of Transfer-Level Math & English (Year 1) • New learning cohorts with embedded tutors (e.g., pre-nursing) • Math Jams during intersession • Reduce Math/English scheduling conflicts • Evening degree pathways with wraparound supports
