2. Two (2) years of high school coursework in the same foreign language with a grade of "C-" or higher.
3. Achieve a score of 3 higher on the College Board Advanced Placement Exam in a language other than English.
4. Achieve a score of 500-540 (depending on the language-verify with counselor) on the SAT II: Subject Test in Languages other than English
5. Achieve a score of 5 or higher on the International Baccalaureate (IB) Examinations in a language other than English. English "O" level exams (score of "A", "B" or "C") and English International "A" exams (score of 5, 6 or 7 ) also accepted.
6. Documented satisfactory completion of 2 or more years of formal schooling at the $6^{\text {th }}$ grade level or higher in an institution where the language of instruction is not English. Must earn a grade of "C" or higher.
7. Statement from a faculty member-verifying competency. Please meet with a counselor for more information on this option.

All California State Universities have a graduation requirement in U.S. History, Constitution, and American Ideals. Although this is not a transfer requirement, it is recommended students take it prior to transfer to a CSU. Courses used to meet this requirement may also be used to meet required units in Area 4. Courses are found in Area 4 in bold and underlined.
 IMPORTANT INFORMATION

All courses on IGETC must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. Grades of "C-" are not acceptable. Each course acceptable for IGETC must have a minimum 3 semester or 4 quarter unit value. Students wishing to use a course to meet an IGETC requirement must be sure that the course is on the approved IGETC list during the academic year when it is taken.

- *UC credit may be limited. (1) No credit given for an introductory course if taken after more advanced college course, (2) credit may be limited for courses with overlapping content, (3) duplicate credit will not be awarded for both the Honors and regular version of a course.
- **Courses taken at regionally accredited colleges or universities that are not part of the California Community College system can meet general education requirements for IGETC. Approval of IGETC placement is done by the Articulation Officer, M. Denise Aceves, via the "Pass Along" review process.
- Certification is a UC admission requirement and students must request certification from the Grossmont College Office of Admissions \& Records.
- Area 7 is a new IGETC requirement for 23-24.
