ANTHROPOLOGY FOR TRANSFER (AA-T)



In support of the established SB 1440, the Student Transfer Achievement Reform (STAR) Act, and the college's mission, vision and values, Grossmont College has created the **Associate in Arts for Transfer in Anthropology** degree. Students earning this Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT) will have fulfilled the lower-division major preparation requirements for a degree considered similar at a participating California State University (CSU) campus.

Anthropology is the study of all aspects of humans, from the earliest primate ancestors to contemporary societies. Students of anthropology learn about human evolution, apply scientific research methods, understand human cultural diversity, and learn to work effectively in a multi-cultural environment. These competencies can help students succeed in a global society.

A major in anthropology offers a solid foundation for students planning undergraduate and graduate work in anthropology, archaeology, or related fields in the social sciences or life sciences. Anthropology is an excellent background for professional training in medicine, education, law, business, or social work, and for careers in the private sector, government, and non-profit organizations.

The following is required for an Associate Degree for Transfer:

1. Minimum of 60 semester or 90 quarter CSU-transferable units.
2. Minimum grade point average (GPA) of at least 2.0 in all CSU-transferable coursework.
3. Minimum of 18 semester or 27 quarter units in the major.
4. A grade of "C" or higher or "Pass" in all courses required for the major.
5. Certified completion of the California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) pattern; see Degree Requirements, General Education & Transfer Information section for more information.

Program Learning Outcomes

1. Upon successful completion of this program, students will be able to:
 1. Describe and apply anthropological perspectives and holistic approaches to cultural and biological systems.
 2. Explain the process of evolution by natural selection, with an emphasis on human and nonhuman primate evolution.
 3. Identify and analyze cultural variation in beliefs, practices, and social organization across and within human groups.

SDSU accepts AA-T degrees in Anthropology and requires letter grades for major preparation courses. Check with a Counselor for applicability to other CSU's. The Anthropology AA-T requires a minimum 2.0 cumulative G.P.A.

Students applying with the AA-T in Anthropology will receive priority in the admissions process but are not guaranteed admittance into the CSU of their choice. Admission is highly competitive for most CSU's. Students are strongly advised to go above and beyond minimum G.P.A requirements and apply for admission at multiple campuses.
